- Founded and based in Tököl
- In 2009
- By the "friends" and supporters of Tököl Prison
- Tököl Prison for Juveniles and Adult Offenders – largest closed institution for juvenile offenders in Hu
- Activities at first mainly concerning Tököl, later broadened country-wise
- No paid staff, unpaid staff: 4, volunteers: 2 people

 - Realized through in-prison programs for both inmates and staff
 - self-awareness education
 - health promotion programs
 - cultural awareness
 - professional competence
- 2) charity work for prison staff in need
